Emergency service will continue to address:

Fire, flood, no heat, problems with smoke or carbon monoxide (CO) detectors, elevator breakdown, problems with exiting or accessing the building or unit, and inability to lock or secure windows and/or doors in the event of a break-in.

There's snow place like home

With snowy days just around the corner, now is the perfect time to clean carports and entrances to homes. This will make shoveling easier!

Snow Removal

Please remember, tenants are responsible for clearing ice and snow from driveways, carports, parking spaces, steps, and landings.

Snow removal companies will clear main roadways and sidewalks. Saltboxes in the communities are property of the snow removal company and are not to be used by tenants. We also ask that tenants do not touch or move the reflective sticks placed by the snow removal company.

Winter Weather Parking Bans

November 15th - April 1st the city may declare a Winter Weather Parking Ban following inclement weather (freezing rain or when Environment Canada forecasts a range of snow more than 7cm).

A Winter Weather Parking Ban supports clearing operations and is issued by the City as a special advisory.

Nepean Housing Snow Dumps & Visitor Parking

Between November - April some visitor parking spots are dedicated snow dumps and are to be kept empty. Prevent damage to your vehicle and or a parking ticket by avoiding these spots, street (and lane) parking, and parking in "No Parking" zones during the winter months.

Frost and Foremost!

Cold weather is coming. Ensure the heat in your unit remains above 15 degrees to prevent frozen pipes, property damage and repair costs.

Garden Homes With Outdoor Water Taps

If you have a functioning tap outside your home, please close and drain the tap to prevent freezing, which can cause pipes to leak or burst.

The Heat is ON!

Please keep all pipes/vent pipes clear of snow. Snow that piles up against the outlet will shut down your furnace causing you to lose heat and risk carbon monoxide poisoning inside your unit. Maintenance calls for this reason can result in a charge to you. Be sure your furnace switch (like a light switch) is in the ON position to work.



Smoking & Vaping:

With cold weather approaching please, respect your neighbours by not smoking or vaping in public and common spaces. Remember, NHC property is smoke free; this includes carports, walkways, roadways, back and front yards, and applies to all (tenants, guests, contractors and staff). Breaking this standard can result in a Notice of Termination.



Pest Control

Have a problem with bed bugs, cockroaches, or other insects or pests? **Notify our office**

immediately. Early detection and reporting are key to controlling the problem.
